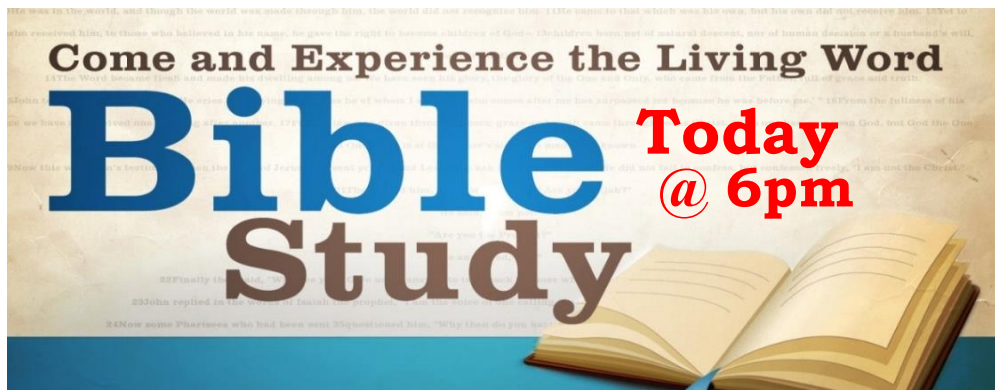
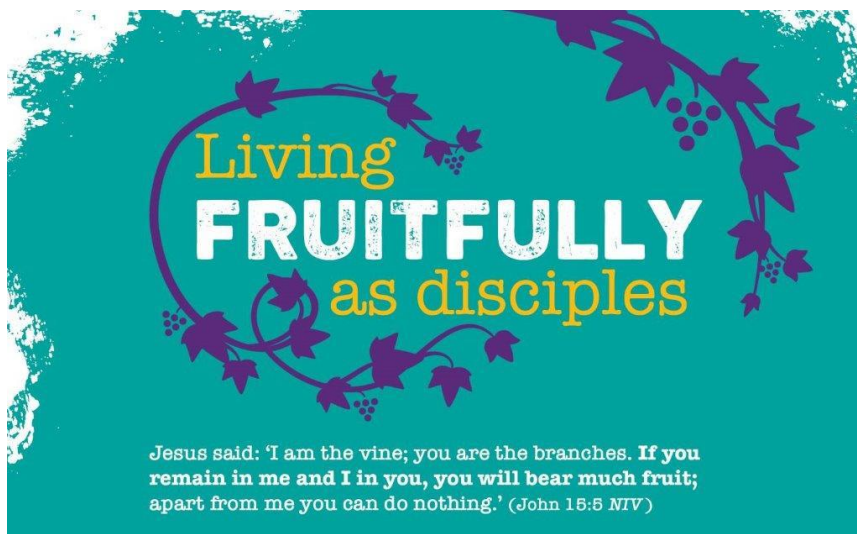

PRAYER MATTERS

I listen to music daily and this week's theme is centred around music I enjoyed last week.

Monday 7 January – Judges 5 v 3. *Beethoven: Symphony No 5 First movement*. A German composer wrote 9 symphonies, 5 piano concertos, 1 violin concerto, 32 piano sonatas, 16 string quartettes, a mass and an opera. He lived 57 years and was deaf most of his life. Let us pray for people suffering with Deafness. Children who are deaf and dumb. Pray for their carers. (Song 916 'Children, Sing for Gladness')

Tuesday 8 January – 1 Chronicles 6 v 31-32. *Dvorak: Symphony No 9 (the melody used for bread adverts)*. A Czech composer. One of Fourteen children. He possessed a strong Christian Faith reflected in the many spiritual works that he composed, including Stabat Mater op 58. Pray for Christian musicians today and for Salvation Army composers who inspire us with their compositions. (Song 939 'We Have Heard the Joyful Sound')

Wednesday 9 January – Psalm 27 v 6 and John 3 v 16. *Brahms: Symphony No 3*. A German composer and pianist living mostly in Vienna. Sadly he was agnostic and a humanist. Pray for people who do not believe in God. John 3 v 16 is foreign to them. (Song 435 'Sinners Jesus will Receive')

Thursday 10 January – Luke 15 v 25. *Berlioz Symphonic fantastique*. A French composer. He wrote symphonies and an opera. He lost 2 wives and a son. He died at 65. Pray for people coping with the loss of close loved ones. Today somebody will lose a close relative, intercede for them. (Song 854 'I will Sing of My Redeemer')

Friday 11 January – 2 Corinthians 1 v 4. *Schubert: Symphony No 9*. An Austrian composer who lived only 31 years, yet wrote more than 600 choral works, 7 symphonies and much more. He suffered with serious health problems before his early passing. Pray for all young people suffering with incurable diseases, some you may know personally. (Song 720 'Wonderful Healer')

Saturday 12 January – Proverbs 3 v 1. *Dumas: The Sorcerer's Apprentice*. Lived 70 years. Born into a Jewish family in Paris. Not so well known as other composers. He was also a great teacher. Pray for teachers in our schools and colleges. How vital their role is. (Song 673 'Saviour Teach Me Day by Day')

Sunday 13 January – Psalm 95. *Rimsky-Korsakov: Scheherazade Festival of Baghdad*. A Russian composer who lived 64 years. A Military man in the Russian Navy who wrote a lot of music at sea. Suffered with depression and heart problems. Like all composers looked at this week they have inspired us with their music. See me if you want details of the CD containing the music featured. Let us worship the Lord today in music and song. Thank God for our musical sections. (Song 52 'O Worship the King, All Glorious Above')
